### VITA (VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE)

CCWVa's Central Region is participating in their third year with the VITA program. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program offers free tax help to people who generally make \$53,000 or less, persons with disabilities, the elderly and limited English speaking taxpayers who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns. IRS-certified volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals.

The agency has been fortunate to retain 5 volunteers to help this tax season; Irene Lueckel, John Pigza, Jill Pigza, Gary Marlin and Betty Haas. These volunteers are certified through

the IRS to prepare taxes through the VITA program. They spent many hours attending trainings and/or taking trainings on-line. This program could not exist without volunteers.



The volunteers have

completed 47 federal tax returns and 50 state tax returns this season resulting in \$60,000 in refunds. The average refunds put over \$1,000 back into the hands of families and into the local economy.



### Welcoming the Stranger

January CCWVa's Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) welcomed two families. One is an Iraqi family of four and the other is a man from Burma who came to be resettled near his girlfriend. Since their arrival MRS has been working with the Refugee Steering Committee from St. Francis DeSales parish, led by Jim Mulhall and Chuck DiSalvo. The Committee has been instrumental in the resettlement of the Iraqi family. Members Debbie Mulhall and Kelly DeLugas along with several other parishioners donated their time and household items which include a television, chairs, beds and a coffee table.

The resettled refugees are regularly taking ESL classes with the Seneca Center and the Literacy Volunteers of Monongalia and Preston Counties. The LVMPC have been supportive and are providing a tutor specifically for these newcomers.

Their resettlement is progressing well in Morgantown. The children are enrolled in school and employment has been secured. The client from Burma is training at Kroger's sushi bar, and the head of household from our Iraqi family has a job offer from Hampton Inn and an interview with WVU.

Support and volunteers from St. Francis DeSales Parish, CCWVa's Parish Social Ministry Coordinator, Kate Kosydar, and the LVMPC are improving the lives of these newcomers as we are called to in the gospel.
